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Clinical peer support	GP in the PCN - or could be provided in a group across the locality to create a group large enough.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Monthly group session with a GP to discuss clinical aspects of cases. ➤ Urgent clinical queries on the day as per the practice arrangement (usual GP, duty GP etc) ➤ Ideally a group of 6-8 link workers 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Understand their role as part of the wider clinical team/MDT ✓ Understand primary care ✓ Put clinical context to their cases ✓ Ensure appropriate utilisation (appropriate cases, and not under utilised) ✓ Guidance on difficult cases ✓ Ask questions ✓ Understand the systems they work in ✓ Understand what the boundaries of their roles are – eg when it's not their job!
Integrated locality support	“Integrated huddles” with other local organisations eg Local Authority, other NHS organisations Organised by the PCLRs	➤ Fortnightly or monthly forum	✓ Supporting personalised care roles to learn, develop and build relationships across the locality.
